Classified Catalogue Code (CCC)

Introduction

The foundation of the classified catalogue code was laid in the year 1924 - 25. When S.R.Ranganathan was in England he decided to bring out a code after returning to Madras, that code was classified catalogue code shortly known as CCC. In CCC, main entry are arranged in a classified orders hence it is called classified catalogue. It has two distinguished parts, the classified part and alphabetical part. The classified part contains the call number or class number entries. The entries are arranged in a defined logical order. The alphabetical part of the catalogue consists of all added entries and they are arranged in alphabetical sequence as in a dictionary. This part of the catalogue serves' as an alphabetical index to the classified section, book index entry and cross reference index entries which are all word entries of the alphabetical section of the catalogue.

Types of Entries

The main entry in CCC is the specific subject entry. For the document, all the added entry are derived from the main entry, In CCC, the main entry is made up of the class number and book number and hence it is also called number entry. All the main entries are arranged according to the call number or class number. This facilitates to know at one glance what documents are available to the library on any given topic.

Added Entry

All the entries other than the main entries are added entries. The number and type of added entries are to be prepared depends upon the nature of the document. In CCC, the added entries have been designed by different names.

1. Cross reference entry.
2. Class index entry.
3. Book index entry.
4. Cross reference index entry.

Cross reference entry

Cross reference entry is a number entry which gives only the class number for a portion of a document.

Class index entry

Class index entry is a word entry and derived by chain procedure from the class number of the main entry.

Book index entry

Book index entry is the added entry given for an author, editor, translator etc. and also under the name of the series and in some cases under the title

Cross reference index entry

Cross reference index entry directs the reader from the one heading to another in the alphabetical part of the catalogue. It is coined with the use of see and see also designation.

Parts of main entry

Main entry in CCC has different section.

Leading section

This is made up of the call number of the document. It is entered on the first horizontal line starting from the first indentation. The call number is to be written with pencil. The class number and book number are separated by two spaces.

Heading section

The name of the author is entered in this section. It can be single, personal author, joint authors, co-operative authors, collaborators etc. also can the title of the document. It starts from the second indentation on the second horizontal line. In this case it cannot be accommodated on the line the continuation starts from the first indentation. Heading section can be divided into

1. Entry element (surname).
2. Secondary element (personal name).
3. Individualising element (years of birth / death)
4. Descriptive element (editor, translator etc.)

The word in the entry element should be written in capital letter except the descriptive elements. The words in the secondary element are to be written in running hand if full name is there. Otherwise the initials are to be written in capital letters. E.g. TAGORE (Rabindranath) (1861) (1941) Tr

In the above example,

TAGORE - Entry element.

(Rabindranath) - Secondary element.

(1861)-Year of birth.

(1941) - Year of death - Individualising element.

(Tr) (Translator) - Descriptive element.

Title section

Title is to be written to the next horizontal line after the heading and it starts from the second indentation and continuation from the first indentation. Edition statement.

Accession number section

In the main entry accession number is given on the bottom most line starting from the first indention.

Tracing section

The purpose of tracing is to show what additional entries for a given document have been required.

I. Name of a person as heading

It is generally observed that the name of a person is multi-warded. It includes Indian names as well as foreign names. In multi-warded name the surname is taken as the entry element for heading as it has got maximum recall value.

II. Name of the government as heading

In case the whole country is taken as author of a document, the name of the country itself is used as a heading without any specification as the name of the country has got full recall value. Maximum number of the readers would like to trace the document by the name of the country. In case it is an organ of a government, which must find a place in the heading. It is mostly a multi-warded name. The words used in it may denote the various purposes. It may be the work of the government. Here the word denoting the work may have greater recall value. For example, ministry of agriculture or the department of agriculture are the subjects and they definitely have greater recall value.

III. In case of the institution, the full name of the institution is taken as entry element. For e.g. Sinha institute of social sciences or Nehru institute of mountaineering, the word Sinha and Nehru are the part of heading and they have greater recall value.

IV. In case of an association the subject is taken as the entry element in the heading as it has greater recall value. For e.g. UP library association, the library is the subject. Hence it will be rendered as library (UP) association.

V. Name of the conference as heading

There are two types of conferences. One is ad hoc conference and other is periodic conference. In case of an ad hoc conference, its name is used as entry element in the heading of the main entry but if it is a periodical conference, it is a difficult case. The name of the conference is not used as heading. The name of the conference is used as heading in the add entry.

So far as diplomatic and non-diplomatic conferences are concerned, the name of the place and subject of the conference is taken respectively as heading for the main entry. For e.g., for Simla conference 1946, the entry will be made in the name of the place SIMLA (conference, 1946)

Series Editor

We will give one example, only to show the tracings that are to be recorded. It does not know how the different entries are arrived at, the purpose is only to show the nothing of tracing. The title page of the book is:

Anglo – American Cataloguing Rules – AACR-II PHYSICAL FORM OF A CATALOGUE CARD

One of the major considerations in the choice of a physical form for a library catalogue is to keep it up to date. The card form of catalogue is best suited to meet this requirement. The structure of the card catalogue, the various sections of an entry and the style of writing are explained in this chapter.

Structure:

The most convenient size of the catalogue card is 12.5*7.5**0.25mm. This size has been adopted universally and considered as a standard size. The entries in the cards may be printed or typed or hand written. Each card bearing a single entry is filed vertically in drawers housed in cabined specially designed for this purpose.

The catalogue card consists of a horizontal line and two vertical lines. The top most horizontal line is called as the Leading Line. The left most vertical line is called the first vertical. The vertical line which is to the right of the first vertical is the second vertical.

The back of the card is used as Tracing section (sixth section in the main Entry. It is divided in to two halves by an imaginary line. The two halves are called as left half and right half.

The right half is divided into three compartments by two imaginary horizontal lines. The three parts thus formed are called the Upper Part the Middle and the Lower part.

In the Upper Part of Right Half the headings of all the class index entries pertaining to the document are accommodated. The headings of the book index entries are listed in the middle part. The lower part consist of the headings of each of the cross reference index entries. The left half of the card is devoted to each of cross reference entries.

Sections of Entry

The leading section is rendered in the leading line of the card. It commences from the first vertical. Its continuation lines will also commence from the first vertical. All the other section except the Accession number section, the index number section and the second section of a series index entry will commence from the second vertical. The continuation lines of all sections will commence from the first vertical. The index number is rendered as far so

to the right in the section preceding it. The accession number section is written on the bottom most line commence from the first vertical. The serial number in the series index entry will commence from the first vertical and the word which follows the serial number will commence from the second vertical.

Rules Part

Types of Entry:

AACR2 is meant for dictionary catalogue in all entries are arranged alphabetically. Entries according to AACR2 can be broadly categorized into three types as follows.

1. Main Entry
2. Added Entries
3. Reference Entries

1. Main Entry:

Main entry is the complete catalogue record of an item, presented in the form by which the entry is to be uniformly identified and cited. It may include the tracings of all other headings under which the record is to be represented in the catalogue.

2. Added Entries:

Added entry is the record of the document other than the main entry. AACR2 glossary defines it to be an entry, additional to main entry added entries are prepared for one document and these entries help easy identification and location of documents by users. For example, if main entry is prepared under joint author, collaborator, title, series or under any other specification by which the document is reasonably sought through the catalogue.

3. Reference Entries:

According to AACR2 Glossary, a reference entry is a direction from one heading to another. Reference entries include see and see also entries etc.

Unit card system simplifies the process of preparing added entries. In this system one main entry card with complete cataloguing information is prepared. The same set of information is repeated exactly in all added entries with different headings which form the possible points of access to users.

2. Monographic Material:

Rendering

From the rules part, you have studied the basic structure of AACR2. In an entry, according to AACR2 forms groups of information, should be given in the entry format.

1. Address
2. Choice of Access Point (Heading)
3. Description and
4. Tracing

1. Address:

It represents the call no & Acc. No of the document call no. Is further subdivided into two parts. They are

- a. Class No
- b. Book No.

The address should be certain on first horizontal line starting from the left edge, but is should not disturb the choice of access points area. If class no. exceeds 8 digits, it could be written just above the first horizontal line. Book no should be rendered in second horizontal line. The call no should be written by PENCIL only. Access in no can be written by pen.

2.Choice of Access Point:(Heading)

AACR2 defines access point as a name, a term, code etc. Under which a bibliographic record may be searched and identified. AACR2 recommends only two access points. They are i) Author and ii) Title. Hence the heading should be rendered under either personal / corporate Author co under title.

3.Description:

Three are eight areas that are mentioned in rules part.

4.Tracing:

AACR2 defines tracing as the record of heading under which an item is represented in the catalogue and record of the references that have been made to a name or to the title or subject of series of an item that is represented in the catalogue. Tracing section is divided into two sub-sections. First section is indicated by Indo-Arabic numerals and second section is by Roman Capital Letters. (I,II,III....) The first section is for subject entries and second one is for other approaches such as title, series, translator etc.

Works of personal Authorship

- 1) Single personal Authorship
- 2) Shared Authorship
 - a) Two Author
 - b) Three Author
 - c) More than three Author
- 3) Pseudonymous Authorship and
- 4) Works of Mixed responsibility.

1.Single personal Authorship:

Rule: Enter a work by one personal author under the heading. Generally surname is given first followed by forename. Two names are separated by a comma.(,)






